



IMPORTANT CHANGES TO POOL SCHEDULE: April 30–May 24

From April 30th–May 24th the YMCA will be hosting 2nd graders from the Roseland School District on Tuesdays & Fridays to participate in a Safety Around Water program. The program will run on Tuesdays & Fridays from 9am–11am & 12:55pm–1:55pm, utilizing both our small and large pools.

Teaching youth to be water safe is critical as drowning is the 2nd leading cause of death for kids ages 5–14. This program will provide vital water safety skills to 200 of our community's youth thanks to funding received from YUSA and New York Life. When looking at shared space in the pool and adding additional programming we try our best to create minimal impact on our members and class participants.

The following adjustments will be made to our pool schedule during the April 30–May 24 timeframe.

- The Small Pool will be CLOSED on Tuesdays & Fridays from 9am–11am and 12:55pm–1:55pm. Regularly scheduled swim lessons that occur on Tuesday mornings will still be held but will be sharing space with the Safety Around Water program. Family Swim will not be available during this time. Water exercise participants will have access to the large pool.
- We will have (2) lap lanes available from 9am–10am on Tuesdays & Fridays. Pre-Post Natal class will share space with the Safety Around Water program.
- We will have (2) lap lanes available from 12:55pm–1:55pm on Tuesdays and from 12:55pm–1:25pm on Fridays.
- During the 10am–11am Arthritis Exercise Class & the 1:30pm–2:25pm Therapeutic Exercise Class we will be splitting the large pool to provide space for class participants and space for the Safety Around Water Program.
- On Thursday, May 16th Adult Open Exercise will be canceled in the small pool beginning at 12:55pm and shared space will be provided for the Therapeutic Exercise Class at 1:30pm. We will provide (2) lap lanes beginning at 12:55pm and shared space with the Therapeutic Exercise class at 1:30pm in the large pool.
- We will work our best to keep the children in the family locker room while they change into dry clothing but based on classroom size we may need to use overflow space in the main locker room.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we work to teach these young children life-saving skills. The Roseland School District is greatly appreciative of this opportunity as are the families. We look forward to providing a warm Y welcome to the staff and children from Sheppard Elementary School, Roseland Elementary School and Roseland Creek Elementary School.
